School Programs

- January-February, offered an in-class program to local school (All About Owls; Getting Ready for Winter) and had 15 classes participate
- May-June and Sept-Oct, offered onsite wetland excursions for Grades K-12 and had 63 classes participate
- Overall hosted students from 30 different schools from 4 school districts
- In total, programs were delivered to 2,123 students which is our highest numbers to date!
