☐ TRACKS (SNOW OR MUD)



Winter wildlife leave evidence that they have been on the move...see if you can find a deer or bird track or? ☐ SHADOWS

Shadows in the winter are longer here because the northern part of Earth is tilted away from the sun. Can you see your long shadow or maybe a trees?

Winter weather brings cold temperatures. Can you find ice on a pond or puddle? An icicle? Or frost?



□ SCAT

Scat, or poop, is another clue that wildlife are active. Deer or owl pellets, coyote scat... What can you find?



☐ LEAVES ON BRANCHES



In the Fall, deciduous trees loose their leaves...but can you find some still hanging on to a branch? Can you identify what kind of tree it is?

 \square CONES

Conifer trees produce cones that contain their seeds. Can you find a cone on the ground or in a tree?



BIRDS

Some birds migrate and some stay and eat at bird feeders or find wild berries and nuts. How many birds can you find on your walk?



 \square CLOUDS

If you look at the sky, can you see any clouds? Are they wispy or puffy? Do they look like something (a moose or a mouse perhaps?)
